

## Nursery 'What a Wonderful World' Homework Suggestions for Spring 2

Please understand that these are suggestions for you to do with your child if you wish, we will welcome any homework that comes into school but it is not compulsory.

### Understanding the World

Tell someone in your family about a place you have visited. How did you travel there? How far away was it? What do you remember about the place?

Ask other people in your family where they have visited. Have they been to another country? Can you find it on a map and can you find some photos of what it was like?

Is it hot or cold in that place?  
Would you like to live there? Why?



### Arts & Design

In the spring lots of flowers grow. Have a walk around your local area to see what flowers you can see in parks & gardens. At home, draw or paint a flower picture. Is it a short/long stem? What colour petals? Does it have big or small leaves?



### The Natural World

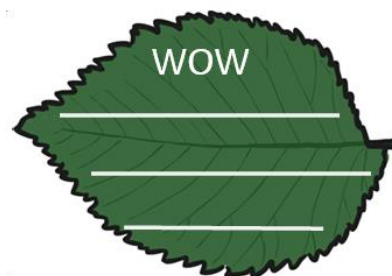
Explore a different landscape with your child physically or using photos;

A riverside, the beach,  
hillside, forest...etc

What do they see, hear & smell here? Is it different to near home?

### Speaking & Listening

Visit your local library to share some stories with settings around the world. What observations do they make of the places they see?

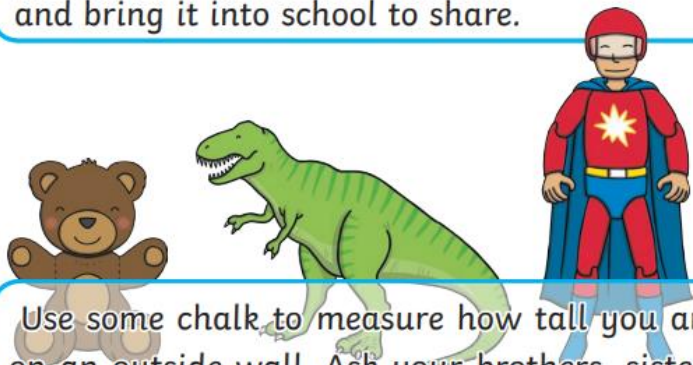

In maths we will be investigating measuring and using comparative vocabulary. You could try some of these activities at home!

## Length

Collect some sticks from outside. Can you put them in order from the shortest to the longest? Can you find something longer than the longest stick? Can you find something shorter than the shortest stick? Take a picture and bring it into school to share.



Use some chalk to measure how tall you are on an outside wall. Ask your brothers, sisters, friends or parents to measure how tall they are too. Who is the tallest? Who is the shortest? Is anyone the same height as somebody else?

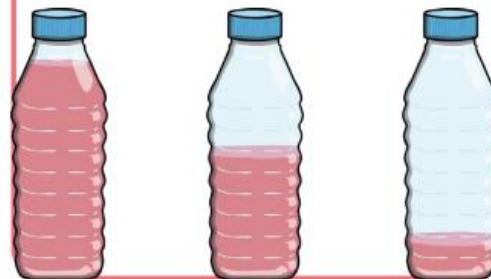
At the sink or in the bath, play with a selection of different-sized containers. Can you fill and empty the containers?



Can you show a container that is full, nearly full, half full, nearly empty and empty?

## Capacity

Take one container and fill it with water, rice or pasta. Can you find another container that would hold more? Can you find a container that would hold less? Can you put the containers in order?



Can you order three objects using the language 'heavy', 'heavier' and 'heaviest'? Pick up the objects to feel the weight and compare them.



## Mass

Can you be a human balancing scale? Ask your grown-up to pass you an object to hold in each hand. Which is heavier? Which is lighter? How can you show this with your arms? What happens if they weigh the same?
