
1   2   4   5   10   20

The factors of 20 are 1, 2, 4, 5, 10 and 20.


The factor pairs are:

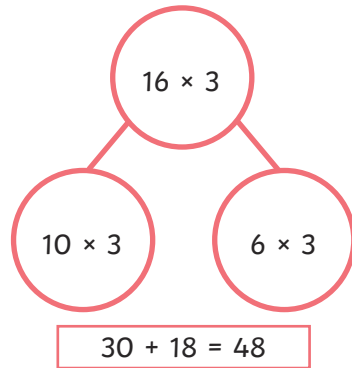
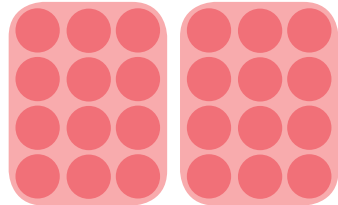
$(2 \times 3) \times 4 = 24$



$(2 \times 4) \times 3 = 24$

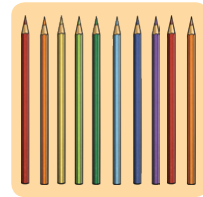


$(3 \times 4) \times 2 = 24$

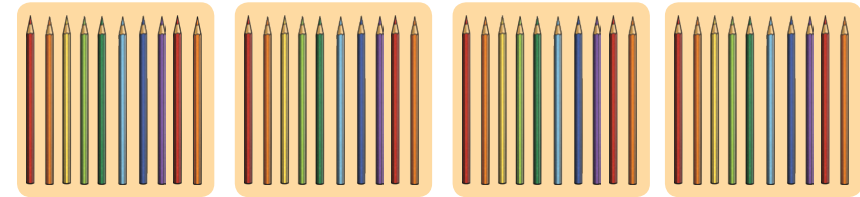


Integer Scaling Problems
